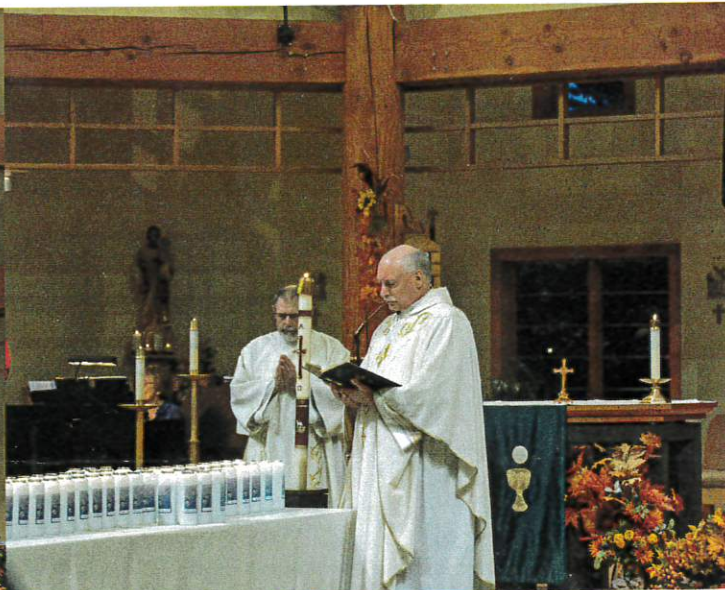

On Monday November 2nd at 5:30 p.m. St. Louis the King will celebrate the Feast of All Souls with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The intention of the Mass is for all souls awaiting the fullness of redemption. We pray in a special way for all of our loved ones that have died this past year.

As in the past a candle representing each of those dear loved ones will be placed before the Altar. The candles will be blessed during the Mass and are then given to the families to bring home.

During the general intercessory prayers the names of the loved ones are read as the funeral bell

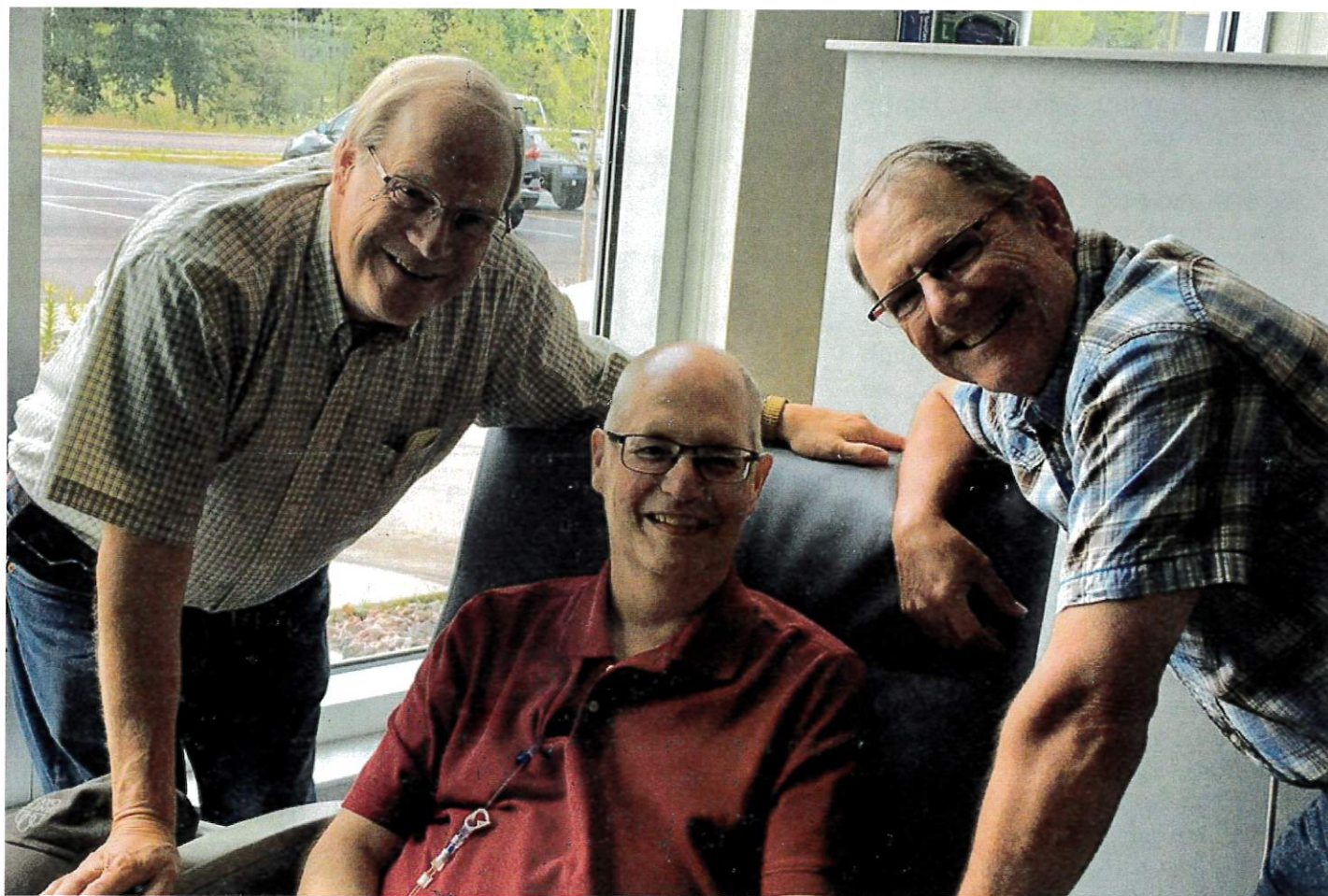
tolls. We believe in the power of the Holy Mass to open the gates of paradise, as we make present again the one sacrifice of Calvary. And we offer up to God our beloved.

Deacon Warren Vonck—Forever In Our Hearts—By Fr. Glenn



On January 25th of this infamous year 2020 the parish family of St. Louis the King lost one of its own, our beloved Deacon Warren Vonck. During my homily I asked everyone to look at the big picture. It is a vision that God has given to us in Christ Jesus. God wants us to know that He has prepared a dwelling place for us. Jesus came into this world of ours to save us, to heal us of our broken and fallen nature, to conquer death forever, and to show us the way to a world beyond the world that we can see right now.

The Risen Lord appeared many times to His apostles and countless others to show us the world beyond. Warren Vonck lived his life with this vision and this conviction of faith. Faith is more than a creed that we say, it is a way of life, a way of living. Warren lived a life of faith.

As I was praying the night before Warren's funeral the words of St. Paul kept coming to me: "Eye has not seen and ear has not heard what God has prepared for those who love Him." St. Paul goes on to say: "It is through the Holy Spirit that we know this." The Holy Spirit was alive and evident in Warren. He was a Spirit filled, Spirit led and Spirit giving person. An amazing Spirit flows through our parish community and Dcn. Warren is an integral part of the fabric of that woven Spirit. Every time I would visit Dcn. Warren in those last days I always came away with more life than I brought with me. The Holy Spirit could not but flow through him to all that he encountered.

As a man of faith Deacon Warren truly lived the Gospel. There is an old adage that says "you might be the only bible that someone ever reads." Our calling as Christians is

to live in just that manner, and Warren did. The incarnation of God and the movement of His love in our world must be in and through us, His Mystical Body here on Earth. Warren was as beacon of God's light and an instrument of His love. Jesus, Himself, was visible in him.

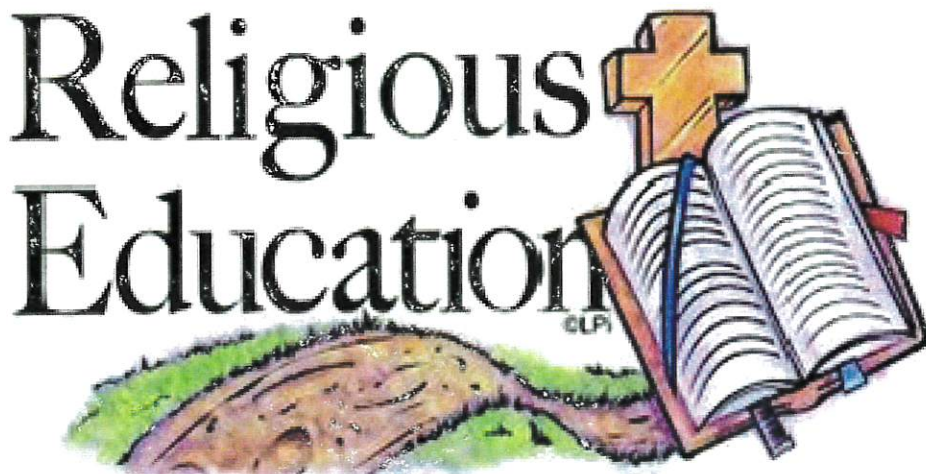
